They include pioneering front wheel drive and rear engine cars from the 1920's and 1930's, and each vehicle was chosen based on the engineering achievements that made it an important part of the evolution of the automobile. These are the cars that set the standards for the engineering of automobiles today. Visitors enjoy a provocative blend of art and science in 12,000 square feet of gallery space.

# Cool Tools for the Garage

I love simple tools that do what you expect them to do, are very reasonable to buy and makes you wonder how you got along without them for so long.

The hubcaps on my truck are secured by three clips with the hub cap sliding over them and snapping into place. To take them off, you have to pry between the cap and the wheel. The first removal of the caps showed me that my wheels were going to look pretty sad with all the chip marks from using a regular screw driver and small plastic body putty paddle. I wasn't too concerned at that point since I was going to have the wheels bead blasted and repainted anyway, but I started looking for an alternative. Enter Hot Rod tools nylon glass filled pry bars. These can he bought from Summit Racing or variety other vendors. http://www.summitracing.com/parts/bjo-ath-k-ngl/overview/ They do exactly what I expected, you can remove your really tight hub caps without any worry of paint chipping or scratches on the hub cap as well. And like most good tools, you will come up with more uses for these where to do not want to mar the surface.


The second little gem is a tool that I have used for almost 40 years and for the most part only Firefighters have been the only ones to use them. They are called Howd Straps and every firefighter has at least one or two stuffed in their bunker coat pocket. They are 6 or 12 foot nylon straps with two loops sown into each end and they are incredibly strong. I have one in each vehicle that I own and have used them time and time again. On my truck when I have to work inside the cab I loop one end around the headlight bracket and the other end goes around door door latch to keep the open. The Annual Board of Directors Meeting took place April 6<sup>th</sup> through 9<sup>th</sup> at the site of the upcoming 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Meet in Lake Tahoe. Four Board members were reelected for 3 additional years, Bryan Felt, Franklin Gage, David Gowan and Jim Gebhardt. The Anniversary meet is proceeding as planned with over 400 rooms booked and 130 vehicles registered so far. 200+ vehicles are planned to be judged including the PCC. The BOD toured the show field site, the hotel grounds for registration, Field Check and activities including the stage and show area for the banquet. All Regions and BOD members have been asked to sell raffle tickets to help support the Meet. A number of changes have been made for judging the CDPC class to help clarify and standardize CDPC judging...we can discuss these at our next meeting. The Vintage Chevrolet Foundation is active now, and a \$100 donation will make you a founding contributor. A brochure is under development and will be available at the '55<sup>th</sup>. We are reprinting our membership brochure, so if you need some additional brochures, please let me or member services know. Two BOD officers were re-elected to two year terms; Jim Amos as Treasurer and Jim Gebhardt as Vice President. The BOD meeting was conducted informally on Wednesday evening and through tours all day Thursday.
